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Webinar Description

The Government of Pakistan's (GoP) aspiration to achieve Universal Health Coverage (UHC) and improve human capital has intensified over the last decade: Pakistan's National Health Vision 2016–2025 recognizes UHC as a top priority; The Prime Minister of Pakistan has made UHC as an explicit policy priority with the expansion of the Sehat Sahulat Program (SSP), social health protection initiative, in Pakistan; and the GoP has been actively involved in the development of a National Essential Package of Health Services (EPHS), which is based on the Disease Control Priorities (DCP3) framework. While the path towards UHC varies across Pakistan's provinces and regions, there is increasing convergence towards achieving this goal.

The GoP faces three major challenges to achieving UHC: the first is ensuring coverage for the informal sector to make UHC truly universal; the second is designing a fiscally sustainable benefit package that is responsive to Pakistan's evolving disease burden; and the third is to ensure supply-side readiness required to deliver quality care that improve health outcomes.

Pakistan's SSP plays a vital role to provide coverage and financial protection to millions of poor households by providing coverage for inpatient services at secondary- and tertiary-level facilities. As the GoP looks to expand the service and population coverage of the SSP program across different regions and health systems, and via reforms like EPHS, it can learn lessons from other national governments that have addressed similar challenges. This seminar will highlight how the Indonesian and Indian governments implemented their social health insurance systems. At the seminar's conclusion, participants will discuss which lessons may be applicable to the Pakistani context.











Webinar Synopsis

The webinar brings together experts from Pakistan to give us an overview of the Sehat Sahulat Program. Country experts from Indonesia and India will discuss their experiences and challenges with providing coverage to the informal sector; designing a fiscally sustainable benefit packages and improving the quality of health service provision.
